Kelly (unmarried) the party of the first part, and William Dawson of the County of Cook and State of Illinois the party of the second part, witnesseth: That the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar lawfull money of the United States of America, to him in hand paid by the said party of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold, remised, released and forever quitclaimed and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell, remise, release and forever quit-claim unto the said party of the second part and to his heirs and assigns, those two certain mining claims in St. Helens Mining District, Skamania County, State of Washington, known as Antelope Discovery No 1 and Antelope Discovery No 2, lying and being at the head waters of Dry Creek a tributary of North Lewis River, more particularly described in the Notice of Location of said claim made and filed by the party of the first part on April 4, 1903 and recorded in Vol. B page 590 and Vol. B page 591 in mining records of said County.
