

Know all men by these Presents, That H. L. Powers, ^{unmarried,} of Portland, County of Multnomah, State of Oregon, in consideration of One & 00/100 Dollars, to him paid by L. A. Burgess of Ripon, County of Wisconsin has bargained and sold, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and convey unto said L. A. Burgess heirs and assigns, all the following bounded and described real property, situated in the County of Skamania and State of Washington:

East half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of Northwest quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$), and Northwest quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of the Northwest quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) in Section thirty-five (35), Township Three (3) North of Range Seven (7) East of Willamette Meridian, containing one hundred and twenty acres more or less.

The Southwest quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of the Southwest quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of Section twenty-six (26), Township three (3) North of Range seven (7) east of Willamette Meridian, containing forty acres more or less.

Beginning at the Northwest quarter post of the Northeast quarter of Section Thirty-five (35), Township Three (3) North of Range Seven (7) east; thence in a Easterly direction along the north line of said Section Thirty-five (35), fifteen (15) chains; thence in a Southerly direction and parallel to the East line of said Section Thirty-five (35) to the south line of the Northeast quarter of Section Thirty-five (35); thence in a Westerly direction upon the South line of the Northeast quarter of said Section Thirty-five (35), Fifteen (15) chains; thence in a Northerly direction along the west line of the Northeast quarter of said Section Thirty-five (35) to a place of beginning.
