

Otto Roebert & wife to D. R. Carrier.

This Indenture, made the 1st day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and two between Otto Roebert and wife of Portland Oregon the parties of the first part and D. R. Carrier the party of the second part, Witnesseth: That the said parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar lawful money of the United States of America, to them in hand paid by the said party of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold, remised, released and forever quitclaimed, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell, remise, release and forever quitclaim unto the said party of the second part, and to his heirs and assigns: The following mining claims to wit: - "Golden Crown" (No. 1.) number one. Beg. at the center of "Devils Slide" (where location notice is posted) and running 1500 ft. East, and 300 feet on each side of center of said vein; also "Golden Crown No. 2" number two, Beginning at what is known as the "Devils Slide" and running 1500 feet West and 300 feet on each side of center of said vein and line. The discovery of the above claims is situated on "Devils Slide" on the North slope of the Black Mountain Range and about 1/4 mile South of the North Tumble River & near the "Minnie Lee Camp" and about 1/2 mile South of the mouth of the "Loah Mountain" Co's Tunnel; and about eight miles North of Mount St. Helens; also "Silver Bell" Discovery (No. 1.) number one. Beg. at the center of the "Devils Slide Creek" (a tributary of the North Tumble River) and running 1500 linear feet east, and 300 feet on each side of center of vein. Also "Silver Bell" Discovery No. 2. Number two; Beg. at the center of "Devils Slide Creek" and running 1500 linear feet West and 300 feet on each side of center of said vein. The discovery of the two last mentioned claims is on "Devils Slide Creek" about 600 feet below or North of the "Golden Crown Discovery" on the North slope of the Black Mountain Range, and about 1/2 mile South of the North Tumble River, at the Minnie Lee Cabin, and about seven miles North of Mt. St. Helens. Being fully described on the Official records at Stevenson, Skamania County, and State of Washington.

Together with all the dips, spurs and angles, and also all the metals, ores, gold and silver bearing quartz, rock and earth therein; and all the rights, privileges and franchises thereto incident, appendant and appurtenant, or therewith usually had and enjoyed; and also all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining, and the rents, issues and profits thereof; and also all the estate, right, title, interest, property, possession, claim and demand whatsoever, as well in law as in equity, of the said parties
