minutes in a northwesterly direction ninety-four and fifty-seven hundredths (94?57) feet to a point of curve; thence on a curve to the right of one hundred and twenty-four and four tenths (124.4 feet radius one hundred and fifteen and three hundredths (115.-03)feet to a point of reverse curve; thence by a curve to the left of three hundred and seventy-five (375) feet radius two hundred and forty-seven and sixt; hundredths (247.06) feet to a point of tangent; thence on a tangent two hundred (200) feet to a point of c urve; thence on a curve to the left of four hundred and eighty (480) feet radius five hundred and three and sixth tenths (503.6) feet to a point of reverse curve; thence by a curve to the right of one hundred and sixty (I60) feet radius one hundred and forty three and nine hundredths (I43.09) feet to a point of tangent; thence on a tangent six ty-(60) feet to a point of curve; thence by a curve to the left of one hundred and ten (IIO) feet radius twenty-two (22) feet; thence on a line in a southwesterly direction at right angles to a tangent line on a curve at the point last mentioned twenty-five (25) feet to a stake, which is the point of beginning of the land here being described; thenc in continuation of the line at right angles to the tangent of the curve above mentioned two hundred and twenty-four (224) feet to a stake; thence in a westerly direction by a curve cherhundred and thirty (130) feet radius ninety-three (93) feet to a point of tangent; thence on a tangent one hundred and seventy-five (175) feet to a point of curva: thence by a curve of one hundred (100) feet radius thirty-six and eighty-two hundredths (36.82) feet to a stake; thence in a northwesterly direction fifty (50) feet to a stake; thence by acurve in a northwesterly direction of one thousand and sixty-seven (IO67) feet radius four hundred and five and ninety-seven hundredths (405.97) feet to a point of compound curve; thence by a curve to the right of one hundred and (IIO) feet radius sixty and twenty-three hudredths (60.23) feet to a point of beginning, at which point of beginning the curve is tangent to a line at right angles to the line on the easterly boundary of the said above described tract of land;
