### Mining Deed.

This Indenture, made the 22<sup>nd</sup> Day of April in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and five (1905) between William Hostetler and Michael Hostetler of Lewis County, State of Washington, parties of the first part, and Wallace Hostetler of the same place, party of the second part, Witnesseth, that the said parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of one Dollar, lawful money of the United States of America and other valuable considerations in hand paid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold, remised, released, conveyed and quitclaimed, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell, remise, release, convey and quitclaim unto the said party of the second part and to his heirs and assigns forever, an undivided one third interest in all the right, title and interest, estate, claim and demands, of said parties of the first part, of, in and to that certain portion, claim and mining right, title and property on the "Rippes" that certain ledge, vein, lode or deposits of quartz and other rock in place, containing precious metals of gold, silver, and other metals, and situated in the St. Helens Mining District, County of Skamania and State of Washington and described as follows, in the "inclosed Location Notice" recorded in the Office of the County Auditor of Skamania County, Washington in Book "B" of Mineral Locations page 202 on Nov. 22, 1901 as follows: Beginning at center of break about 500 feet from base of Mt. Dismark on the southeast side of said mountain and running 1500 feet in a Northwesterly direction with 300 feet on each side of the vein. Corners are trees blazed on four sides with names of corner and lode written plainly thereon, boundaries marked by blazed trees on all sides and ends; situated in St. Helens Mining District, Skamania County, Washington, about one mile east of Meta Lake and is on the same vein as the Chief.
