Perria and to his heirs and assigns forever. And there is reserved, from the lands hereby granted, a right of way therein for ditches or canals, constructed by authority of the United States.

Given under my hand at the City of Washington, the first day of September nine hundred and four and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and twenty-ninth.
