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Corlie to Hamlin & Whiteside

This Indenture of mortgage made this 1st day of June 1910

Between G.C. Corlie, his heirs and assigns, party of the first part (hereinafter called "said mortgagor") and Hugh W. Hamlin and George S. Whiteside (also known as Hamlin and Whiteside) parties of the second part (hereinafter called the mortgagees), Witnesseth:

That said mortgage for and in consideration of (\$500.00) five hundred dollars and the signing of the notes hereinafter mentioned by the mortgagor by these present do grant, bargain sell and convey unto said mortgagee, his successors and assigns all the following described real property situated in the County of Skamania State of Washington to-wit:

The following described piece of land lying in the east half of the northwest quarter of section nineteen, township three North of Range ten East of Willamette Meridian and more particularly described as follows to-wit: Behinning at an iron pipe marking the Northwest corner of a tract of twenty eight (28) acres conveyed by George Whiteside and wife to W.M. Kollock by deed recorded in Book L of deeds records of Skamania County Washington at page 227, running thence northerly direction along the west boundary line, if extended, of said twenty eight acre tract five hundred (500) feet to an iron pipe in the south line of a tract sixty one (61) acres heretofore conveyed by said George S.
