

Right of Way Deed

The Grantor for and in consideration of the sum of Two hundred dollars, in hand paid, convey and warrant to the Portland and Seattle Railway Company, a Washington corporation, its successors and assigns, the following described real estate situate in the County of Skamania, State of Washington, as:

A strip of land one hundred feet in width being fifty feet in width on each side of the center line of the railroad of said Railway Company, is now located, staked out and to be constructed over and across that tract of land owned by the undersigned in Section Eleven, Township one, North Range five East, W. M. known and described as twenty four acres in one body off the south end of Lot one, in said section, Township and range, and the shorelands adjacent thereto, including the possession rights of the grantors herein to purchase the portion of said shorelands contained within said strip, and consideration also being in full settlement of all claims and demands for damages sustained by reason of the location, construction and operation of said railroad on, over and across said described land. The grantors to have the right to a crossing to be located at some point on said strip of land.
