

George Udell to P. & S. Ry. Co.

The Grantors for and in consideration of the sum of One Hundred Eighty dollars, in hand paid, convey and warrant to the Portland and Seattle Railway Company, a Washington Corporation, its successors and assigns, the following described real estate situate in the County of Skamania State of Washington, viz:

A strip of land ~~one~~ hundred feet in width, being fifty feet in width on each side of the center line of the railroad of said Railway Company, is now located, staked out and to be constructed over and across Lots six and nine, in Section one, Township two, North, Range seven, East Willamette Meridian. and the shore lands adjacent thereto, including the preference right of the grantors herein to purchase the portion of said shore lands contained within said strip, together with the privilege of obtaining necessary material for construction of said railroad across said premises, from lands outside of and adjacent to the above described strip, said consideration also being in full settlement of all claims and demands for damage sustained by reason of the location, construction, maintenance and operation of said railroad on, over and across said described land.

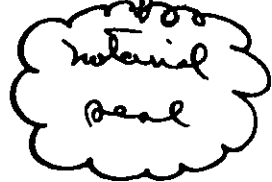
