

Dixie Queen Mining Co. Ore. to Dixie Queen Mining Co. Wash.

This Indenture, made this 22nd day of August 1903 by and between The Dixie Queen Mining Company, a corporation duly incorporated and organized under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Oregon, party of the first part and the Dixie Queen Mining Company a corporation duly incorporated and organized under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Washington, party of the second part, Witnesseth, that the said party of the first part for and in consideration of one Dollar and other good and valuable considerations to it paid by the said party of the second part, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold, remised, released and forever quitclaimed unto the said party of the second part, its successors and assigns forever all the following described mining property situated in the St. Helens Mining District and in Skamania County, State of Washington, and more particularly described as follows, to-wit: - I

The Mountain King Lode Discovery Claim No 1 Northeast, beginning at the base of what is known as Mountain King Falls, which is the first Falls east and above what is known as the forks of the North Toutle River and Mining Creek and at the discovery point of said claim, and running from said discovery point in a northeasterly direction fifteen hundred ^{linear} feet along the center line of said lode and three hundred linear feet in width on each side of the center line of said claim, the center end lines and corners of said claim being marked by blazed trees with the respective center end lines and corners marked thereon. II.

The Mountain King Lode Discovery Claim No 2 Southwest, beginning at the discovery which is at the base of what is known as Mountain King Falls, being the first prominent falls above and east of what is known as the forks of the North Toutle River and Mining Creek, and extending from said discovery point in a southwesterly direction fifteen hundred linear feet in length and three hundred linear feet in width on each side of the center line of said lode, being bounded on the northeast end line by the Mountain King Lode Discovery No 1 Northeast, the center end lines and corners of which are marked by blazed trees, with the respective center end lines and corners marked thereon.

III. The Blue Bird Discovery Claim No 1 East, beginning at the discovery which is about 500 feet east of the Mountain King Lode and of the Mountain King Falls, being the first prominent Falls east and up and above the forks of the North Toutle River and Mining Creek, and extending from said discovery point in an easterly direction along the center line of said lode 1500 linear feet and being 300 feet in width on each side of said center line, the center end lines and corners of said claim are marked with blazed trees with the respective center end lines and corners marked thereon.

IV. The Blue Bird Lode Discovery Claim No 2 West, beginning at the discovery thereof which is about 300 feet east of the Mountain King Lode and of what is known as Mountain King Falls, which is about one half mile from and the first prominent falls east and up from the well known forks of the North Toutle River and Mining Creek, extending from said discovery in a westerly direction 1500 feet along the center line of said lode and 300 feet in width on each side of the center line of said lode the respective center end lines and corners are marked by blazed trees with the respective center end lines and corners marked thereon, being bounded on the east by the Blue Bird Discovery Claim No 1. East.

V. The Star King Lode First Discovery No 1. East, beginning at the top of what is known as Box Creek Canyon Falls and on the north side thereof and about 25 feet E. S. E. from notice placed on Yellow Cedar tree which is on the Southwest slope of the
