The United States of America,

To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting;

Whereas, In pursuance of the provisions of the Revised Statutes of the United States, Chapter Six, Title Thirty-two, and legislation supplemental thereto, there have been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States the Plat and Field notes of survey and the Certificate, No. 5 of the Register of the Land Office at Vancouver in the State of Washington accompanied by other evidence whereby it appears that Henry W. Coe did on the thirty-first day of December, A.D. 1904, duly enter and pay for that certain mining claim or premises, known as the Earl No. 1, Earl No. 2, Earl No. 3, Earl No. 4, Earl No. 5, Earl No. 6, Earl No. 7, Earl No. 8, Earl No. 9, Earl No. 10, Earl No. 11, Earl No. 12, and Earl No. 13 lode mining claims designated by the Surveyor-General as Lot No. 774, embracing a portion of sections eight, nine, sixteen and seventeen, in township ten north of range six east, Willamette meridian in the St. Helens mining District, in the County of Skamania and State of Washington, in the District of lands subject to sale at Vancouver and bounded, described, and platted as follows, with magnetic variation as hereinafter stated.

Beginning for the description of the Earl No. 1 lode claim at corner No. 1, in wash-out and not established, from which the corner common to sections eight, nine, sixteen and seventeen, in township ten north of range six east, Willamette meridian bears north seventy-two degrees and fifty-two minutes east nine hundred and seventy-eight and fifty-one hundredths feet distant.

Thence, first course, magnetic variation twenty-three degrees east, with twenty-five degrees and fifty-minutes west three hundred feet to corner No. 2, a cedar post six inches square marked 2-774 and 4-774, with a tack in post for exact point, from which discovery post bears south thirty-three degrees and twenty minutes west thirty feet distant; six hundred feet to corner No. 3, a fir post six inches square marked 3-774, 3-774, 4-774 and 1-774 in rock bed and mound of stones with a tack in post for exact point.

Thence, second course, magnetic variation twenty-three degrees east, south sixty-four degrees and ten minutes west one thousand five hundred feet to corner No. 4, a fir post five inches square marked 4-774 with a tack in post for exact center.

Thence, third course, magnetic variation twenty-two degrees and thirty minutes east, south twenty-five degrees and fifty minutes east six hundred feet to corner No. 5, a fir post six inches square marked 5-774, from which U.S. location monument No. 4, bears south
