

OF SURFACE WATER RIGHT

(Laws of Washington for 1929, and amendments thereto, and the rules and regulations of the State Supervisor of Water Resources thereunder.)

I, RICHARD G. JONES, State of Washington, has made proof to the satisfaction of the State Supervisor of Water Resources of Washington, of a right to the use of the waters of Wapato Creek, a tributary of Little White Salmon River, with point or points of diversion within the NE 1/4 of SE 1/4 of

Sec. 35, Twp. 4, N. R. 9 E., W. M., under and subject to provisions contained in Appropriation Permit No. 9494, issued by the State Supervisor of Water Resources, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Washington, and is hereby confirmed by the State Supervisor of Water Resources of Washington and entered of record in Volume 9, at Page 6210, on the 3rd day of October, 1955; that the priority date of the right hereby confirmed is February 3, 1955; that the amount of water under the right hereby confirmed, for the following purposes is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed.

0.31 of a cubic foot per second for the purposes

of domestic supply and the irrigation of 1/2 acre.

A description of the lands under such right to which the water right is appurtenant, and the place where such water is put to beneficial use, is as follows:

That portion of the SE 1/4 of SE 1/4 of Section 26, Township 4 N., Range 9 E.W.M., bounded and described as follows: Commencing at the intersection of the east-side of the county road with the southwesterly bank of the Little White Salmon River. Which said point is at or near the quarter section line between the SE 1/4 and SW 1/4 of said Section 26; thence in a southeasterly direction along the bank of said Little White Salmon River to intersection with the section line of said Section 26 and Section 35, said township and range; thence West to the easterly line of the county road; thence northerly along said county road to point of beginning. Consisting of three-fourths of an acre, more or less.



The use of the water aforesaid hereby confirmed is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described, except as provided in Sections 6 and 7, Chapter 122, Laws of 1929.
