Melvin et al to Gilman

This Indenture witnesseth that we Frank Melvin and Anna M. Melvin, husband and wife and Millard Armstrong of Portland, Oregon, parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of four thousand (\$4000.00) dollars to us in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained and sold and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and convey unto D.E. Gilman of Heppner, Oregon, the party of the second part the following described real property to-wit: The East half of the southeast quarter of section twenty five Township three North of Range eight East of Willamette Meridian in Skamania county State of Washington. Together with tenements hereditaments and appurtenances therunto belonging or in anywise appertaining. To have and to hold the same with the appurtenances unto the said D.E. Gilman his heirs and assigns forever. This conveyance is intended as a purchase money mortgage to secure the payment of the sum of four thousand (\$4000.00) dollars in accordance with the tenor of one certain instrument of writing of which the following is a true copy to-wit:

Portland, Oregon, November 26th 1910

On or before three years after date without grace we promise to pay to the order of D.E. Gilman at Portland, Oregon the sum of four thousand (\$4000.00) dollars in Gold coin of the United States of the present standard value, with interest thereon at the rate of ten per cent per annum from date until paid for value received. Interest to be paid semi-annually and if not so paid the whole sum of both principal and interest to become immediately due and collectible at the option of the holder of this note. And in case suit or action is instituted to collect this note or any portion thereof we promise to pay in addition to the costs and disbursements provided by statute, such additional sum as the court may adjudge reasonable as attorneys fees to be allowed in said suit or action.
