

Timber and trees and to remove the same, when and as he or his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns shall think proper, within the time hereinafter stated, to-wit: Within the period of five (5) years next after the date hereof. And he is further granted the full right and authority to construct flumes, roads, railways, telegraphs, telephones or any other means of transportation, requisite, necessary or convenient to carry and transfer the said timber when felled, or the products thereof from and off the said land to have and to hold the above described premises unto the said Frank C. Bolin, and his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns; and we the said grantees do covenant to and with the said grantee, his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns that the above granted premises are free from all incumbrances and that we have a good right to make the grants herein and hereby made, and that we will, and our heirs, executors, administrators and assigns shall warrant and defend the title thereto and every part and parcel thereof against the lawful claims and demands of all persons whomsoever.
