United States to H. S. Gung.

The United States of America, To all whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

No 1. Whereas There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Vancouver, Washington, whereby it appears that in accordance with the provisions of the act of Congress approved February 24, 1905 entitled 'An Act for the relief of certain homestead settlers in the State of Alabama', Hampton S. Gung has entered the lot numbered three of Section Thirty-five, in Township three North of Range eight east of Willamette Meridian in Washington, containing forty-five acres and seventy hundredths of an acre

Now Know Ye, That The United States of America, In consideration of the premises, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant unto the said Hampton S. Gung, and to his heirs, the lands above described; Do Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said Hampton S. Gung, and to his heirs and assigns forever. And there is reserved, from the lands hereby granted, a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by authority of the United States.

In Testimony Whereof, I, Theodore Roosevelt, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

Given under my hand, and at the City of Washington, the Thirteenth day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and six, and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and Thirtieth.
