

E. B. Perrin to Peter Alex.

Know all men by these Presents, That Whereas Edward B. Perrin, of the County of Coconino,
Territory of Arizona, was on the 29th day of January, 1903, the owner of the following described
land, to-wit: the south half of southwest quarter of section twenty-one, Township twenty-
one $\frac{1}{4}$ north of range two $\frac{1}{4}$ east, Coconino County, Territory of Arizona, containing 80
acres, which land was at that time within the limits of the San Francisco Mountains Forest
Reserve in the Territory of Arizona. And, Whereas, on the 29th day of January, 1903, said
Edward B. Perrin and Lila M. Perrin, his wife, relinquished the same to the United States
of America by deed of conveyance under the act of Congress of June 4, 1897, which Act
provides that any person owning land within the limits of a forest reserve may relinquish
the same to the Government, and in such cases the party so relinquishing his lands to
the United States may select an equal quantity of public lands open to settlement outside
of a forest reservation. Now Therefore, Know all men by these Presents, that the said
Edward B. Perrin and Lila M. Perrin, his wife, by Hartwell D. Congdon of the County of
Multnomah, State of Oregon, their attorney in fact, by power of attorney duly authorized
for and in consideration of the premises and the right to collect & select 80 acres of land
elsewhere, which right was exercised on the 18. day of April 1904, by selecting in lieu thereof
lot one $\frac{1}{4}$ and southeast quarter of northwest quarter of section eighteen $\frac{1}{4}$, Township
two $\frac{1}{4}$ north, range seven $\frac{1}{4}$ east, Willamette Meridian, containing 90 $\frac{60}{100}$ acres of land
more or less, situated in the County of Skamania, state of Washington, and in consideration of
the foregoing and the sum of ten $\frac{1}{10}$ dollars lawful money in hand paid by Nicholas
Frederick Peter Ales, of the County of Multnomah, State of Oregon, to the said Edward
B. Perrin and Lila M. Perrin, his wife, do hereby grant, bargain, sell, assign, convey and
confirm unto the said Nicholas, Frederick Peter Ales, his heirs and assigns forever, all
right, claim, title and interest of every nature and description which said grantees now own
or may hereafter acquire by reason of said his selection, in and to the said lot one
 $\frac{1}{4}$ and the southeast quarter of northwest quarter of section eighteen $\frac{1}{4}$ Township two
 $\frac{1}{4}$ north, range seven $\frac{1}{4}$ east Willamette Meridian, containing 90 $\frac{60}{100}$ acres of land
more or less. To have and to hold the same forever, and the said Edward B. Perrin and
Lila M. Perrin, his wife, do hereby covenant to and with the said Nicholas Frederick
Peter Ales to warrant and defend the title of the same against the said grantees, their
heirs and assigns forever.
