Schullhorn claim; the west half of the northeast quarter, the northwest quarter of the northeast quarter and the northwest quarter of the southwest quarter of section thirteen <13>, containing one hundred and sixty <160> acres of land, known on said plat as the William Ingles claim; the north half of the northwest quarter, the southwest quarter of the northwest quarter and the northwest quarter of the northeast quarter of said section thirteen, containing one hundred and sixty <160> acres of land, known on said plat as the David H. Ordway claim; the southeast quarter of the northwest quarter, the north half of the southwest quarter, and the southeast quarter of the north southwest quarter of said section thirteen, containing one hundred and sixty <160> acres of land, known on said plat as the David H. Ordway claim No. Two; the south half of the northeast quarter of the northeast quarter and the southeast quarter of the northeast quarter of section fourteen <14>, containing sixty <60> acres of land, known on the said plat as the south three quarters of the George W. Weidler claim; the east half of the southeast quarter of said section fourteen, containing eighty <80> acres of land, known on said plat as the Milton Weidler claim; the west half of the northwest quarter, and the southwest quarter of the southwest quarter of section twenty-four <24>, containing one hundred and twenty <120> acres of land, known on said plat as the north half and south quarter of the John R. Fisher claim; lot one <1> of section thirty-six <36>, containing twenty-one and  $\frac{10}{100}$  <21.10> acres of land, and so designated on said plat, containing in the aggregate fourteen hundred and sixty three and  $\frac{72}{100}$  <1463.72> acres of land, all situate in Township three north of Range nine east of the Willamette Meridian, also the flume and all the easements and rights of way, to the same belonging, together with the waterright for operating said flume, which with the aforesaid lands were acquired by several conveyances from the Oregon Lumber Company. Also all waterrights and easements, however acquired, to said lands appertaining, intending hereby to convey by this deed all property and rights of whatever nature and however acquired, now belonging to the grantors herein named, in the said premises, but subject to the reservations contained in a deed to said premises from John Leland Henderson, Marian J. Henderson, J. F. Short, Eudora Short, John S. Carey, Jennie Carey and David A. McFarlane to Tyler Woodward, trustee, dated the 19th day of May, 1903, and recorded on pages 443 to 445 in book "H" of Deeds of Skamania County, state of Washington, on the 27th day of May, 1903.
