This Indenture made this third day of January, A. D. 1905 between Viola M. Coe and N.W. Rountree and Nellie E. Rountree, the last two husband and wife, all of Portland, state of Oregon, Witnesses: That the parties of the first part, and Henry W. Coe, of Portland, state of Oregon, party of the second part, Witnesseth: That the said parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of one Dollar, lawful money of the United States of America to them in hand paid by the said party of the second part, do by these presents, remise, release, convey, and quitclaim, unto the said party of the second part, his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns, all interest of the parties of the first part in the following described real estate, lying and being in the County of Skamania, State of Washington, to-wit:

Those certain mining claims or premises known as the Chicago North West Discovery, Chicago Northwest Discovery No 1, and Chicago Northwest Discovery No 2, lode mining claims, designated by the Surveyor General as Lot No 621, embracing a portion of the unsurveyed public domain, in St. Helens (unorganized) mining District, said County, a particular and minute description of which is set forth in the patent therefor issued to said Henry W.
