Beginning for description of the Denmark Discovery Land claim, at corner No 1, a larch post four inches square scribed 1-620 and 3-620 from which U.S. location monument No 1 bears north one degree and nineteen minutes west one thousand three hundred and forty-nine and ninety-eight hundredths feet distant; a larch forty inches in diameter scribed 1-3-620 B. T. + bears south seventy-one degrees and twenty-nine minutes east eleven and four tenths feet distant; and a larch twelve inches in diameter scribed 1-3-620 B. T. + bears north eight degrees and forty-six minutes east seventeen and eight tenths feet distant. Therein, first course, south one degree and thirty-two minutes east eight hundred feet to corner No 2. Therein, second course, south eighty-eight degrees and twenty-eight minutes west three hundred feet to corner No 3, six hundred feet to corner No 4. Therein, third course, north one degree and thirty-two minutes west eight hundred feet to corner No 5. Therein, fourth course, north eighty-eight degrees and twenty-eight minutes east three hundred feet to a point from which Discovery bears south one degree and thirty-two minutes east seven hundred and seventy-five feet distant; six hundred feet to corner No 1. the place of beginning; the survey of the land claim as above described extending eight hundred feet in length along said Denmark Discovery vein or lode.

Beginning for the description of the Norway Land claim at corner No 1, a larch post four inches square, scribed 1-620 and 2-620, from which said U.S. location monument bears north twenty-five degrees and seventeen minutes east one hundred and seventy-six and three tenths feet distant, a cedar fourteen inches in diameter scribed 1-2-620 B. T. bears north twenty-four degrees and fifty-five minutes east twenty-seven and four tenths feet distant, a cedar fourteen inches in diameter scribed 1-2-620 B. T. + bears south eighteen degrees and forty-two minutes west thirteen and sixteen feet distant, and a cedar twelve inches in diameter scribed 1-2-620 B. T. + bears north seventy-four degrees and forty-eight minutes west eight and four tenths feet distant. Therein, first course, south nine degrees and nine minutes east five hundred and sixty-two and five tenths feet to corner No 2. Therein, second course, south one degree and thirty-two minutes east six hundred and thirty-five and one tenth feet to corner No 3, identical with corner No 1 of said Denmark Discovery Land claim. Therein, third course, south eighty-eight degrees and twenty-eight minutes west one thousand six hundred feet to corner No 4, identical with corner No 5 of said Denmark Discovery Land claim. Therein, fourth course, north one degree and thirty-two minutes west, one thousand one hundred and ninety-two and sixteen tenths feet to corner No 5. Therein, fifth course, north eighty-eight degrees and twenty-eight minutes east three hundred feet to a point from which Discovery post bears south one degree and thirty-two minutes east one hundred and twenty-seven feet distant; five hundred and twenty-five feet and five tenths feet to corner No 1, the place of beginning; the survey
