

of the lode claim as above described extending one thousand, one hundred and ninety-two and nine tenths feet in length along said Norway vein or lode.

Beginning for the description of the Norway Northwest Discovery lode claim at corner No 1, a fair post four inches square scribed 1-620, with tack for center, from which a larch twenty inches in diameter scribed 1-620 B. T. + bears north sixteen degrees and fifty-two minutes east twenty-three and nine tenths feet distant; a larch twelve inches in diameter scribed 1-620 B. T. + bears south eighty two degrees and thirty two minutes east twenty-one and nine tenths feet distant; a larch twenty four inches in diameter scribed 1-620 B. T. + bears north seventy-two degrees and forty-two minutes west sixteen and five tenths feet distant; and said U. S. Location monument bears south ten degrees and twenty-two minutes east one thousand three hundred and fifty three and two tenths feet distant. Thence, first course, south six degrees and twenty-six minutes east one thousand five hundred feet to corner No 2, identical with corner No 1 of said Norway Lode Claim. Thence, second course, south eighty-eight degrees and twenty-eight minutes west two hundred and twenty-five and five tenths feet to a point from which Discovery, ^{north} bears north six degrees and twenty-six minutes west five feet distant; five hundred and twenty-five and five tenths feet to corner No 3, identical with corner No 5 of said Norway lode claim. Thence, third course, north six degrees and twenty-six minutes west one thousand five hundred feet to corner No 4. Thence, fourth course, north eighty-eight degrees and twenty-eight minutes east five hundred and twenty-five and five tenths feet to corner No 1, the place of beginning; the survey of the lode claim as above described extending one thousand five hundred feet in length along said Norway Northwest Discovery vein or lode. Said lot No 620 containing forty-four acres and nine hundred and ninety-nine thousandths of an acre of land, more or less.

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore hereby granted by the United States unto the said Henry Waldo Bee and Viola M. Bee and to their heirs and assigns, the said mining premises hereinbefore described, and not expressly excepted from these grants, and all that portion of the said Denmark Discovery, Norway and Norway Northwest Discovery veins, lodes or ledges and all other veins, lodes or ledges, throughout their entire depth, the tops or apices of which lie inside the surface boundary lines of said granted premises in said lot No 620 extended downward vertically, although such veins, lodes or ledges in their downward course may so far depart from a perpendicular as to extend outside the vertical side lines of said premises: Provided, That the right of possession of such outside parts of said veins, lodes or ledges, shall be confined to such portions thereof as lie between vertical planes drawn downward through the end lines of said lot No 620, so continued in their own direction that such planes will intersect such exterior parts of said veins, lodes or ledges: And provided further, That nothing herein contained shall authorize the grantees herein to extend beyond the surface of a claim owned or possessed by another.

To Have and to Hold said mining premises, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatever nature thereto belonging unto the said grantees above named and to their heirs and assigns forever, subject however to the above mentioned and to the following conditions and stipulations:
