I, Loren E. Lawrence, Vice Consul of the United States of America in and for the consular district of Hong Kong, B.C.C., duly commissioned and qualified, hereby certify that the attached documents are to accompany the remains of John Chauncey PRICE, citizen of the United States who died at Hong Kong, B.C.C., on November 1, 1960; that, according to the Certificate of Cremation, the remains were cremated at the Diamond Hill (Government) Crematorium, Hong Kong, on November 4, 1960, and are to be airshipped from the port of Hong Kong, B.C.C., on or about November 8, 1960; that the metal box containing the ashes has been hermetically sealed and is wrapped in paper to which is affixed a transit label corresponding with the attached removal authorization; and that the remains are to be entered at the port of New York, N.Y., arriving via Pan American World Airways Flight #1 on about November 9, 1960.


