## CERTIFICATE OF SURFACE WATER RIGHT

(In accordance with the provisions of Chapter 117, Laws of Washington for 1917, and amendment thereto, and the rules and regulations of the Department of Ecology.)

THIS IS TO CERTIFY That

C. REX JULIAN

of Washougal, Washington, has made  
proof to the satisfaction of the Department of Ecology of a right to the use of the public surface waters  
of the State of Washington from an unnamed stream  
a tributary of Washougal River, with point of diversion within its impoundment.

Sec. 33, Twp. 2 N., R. 5 E., W.M. for the purpose(s) of fish propagation

under and specifically subject  
to provisions contained in Appropriation Reservoir Permit No. R-381  
and storage Permit No. 14175 issued by the

Department of Ecology, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance  
with the laws of Washington, and is hereby confirmed by the Department of Ecology and entered of

record in Volume 23, at Page 11271; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from  
September 21, 1965 (Reservoir)  
October 20, 1965 (Appropriation) that the quantity of water under the right hereby confirmed, for

the aforesaid purposes is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.20  
cubic foot per second, non-consumptive, for fish propagation, continuously; and for the  
storage of 2.5 acre-feet of water, for fish propagation.

A description of the lands to which such surface water right is appurtenant is as follows:

The west 1430 feet of the east 1760 feet of S $\frac{1}{2}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Sec. 33, T. 2 N., R. 5 E.W.M.



The right to the use of the water aforesaid hereby confirmed is restricted to the lands or place  
of use herein described, except as provided in RCW 90.03.380 and 90.03.390.

This certificate of surface water right is specifically subject to relinquishment for nonuse of water as  
provided in RCW 90.03.450.
