THIS IS TO CERTIFY That MARTIN F. NIELSEN
 of White Salmon, Washington, has made
 proof to the satisfaction of the Department of Ecology of a right to the use of the public surface waters
 of the State of Washington from an unnamed spring
 a tributary of _____, with point of diversion within Lot 1, Block 12 of
the plat of Manzanola Orchard Tracts, within
Sec. 10, Twp. 3 N., R. 9 E., W.M. for the purpose(s) of domestic supply and
irrigation under and specifically subject
 to provisions contained in appropriation Permit No. 16651 issued by the
 Department of Ecology, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance
 with the laws of Washington, and is hereby confirmed by the Department of Ecology and entered of
 record in Volume 24, at Page 11839; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from
July 7, 1970; that the quantity of water under the right hereby confirmed, for
 the aforesaid purposes is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.01
cubic foot per second, 1 acre-foot per year, continuously each year, for domestic supply

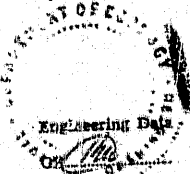
A description of the lands to which such surface water right is appurtenant is as follows:

Lot 2, Block 11 of the plat of Manzanola Orchard Tracts within Sec. 10, T. 3 N., R. 9 E.W.M.,
LESS rights of way.



The right to the use of the water aforesaid hereby confirmed is restricted to the lands or place
 of use herein described, except as provided in RCW 90.03.380 and 90.03.390.
 This certificate of surface water right is specifically subject to relinquishment for nonuse of water as
 provided in RCW 90.14.130.
