To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, In pursuance of the provisions of the Revised Statutes of the United States, Chapter Six, Title Thirty-two, and legislation supplemental thereto, there have been deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE of the United States the Plat and field Notes of survey and the Certificate, No.6, of the Register of the Land Office at Vancouver, in the State of Washington accompanied by other evidence whereby it appears that Henry W.Coe did, on the fifth day of July, A.D.1905, duly enter and pay for that certain mining claim or premises, known as the Index Group consisting of the Index No.1, Index No.2, Index No.3, Index No.4, Index No.5, Index No.6, Index No.7, Index No.8, Index No.9, Index No.10, Index No.11 and Index No.12, lode mining claims designated by the Surveyor-General as Lot No.779, embracing a portion of Sections seventeen eighteen, nineteen and twenty in township ten north of range six east, Willamette meridian in the St. Helens Mining District, in the County of Skamania and State of Washington, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Vancouver and bounded, described, and platted as follows, with magnetic variations as hereinafter stated for the Index No.1 and Index No.2 lode claims, and 23° E. for all other claims.

Beginning at corner No.1, a large post four inches square, four feet long, marked I-779, from which the corner common to sections seventeen, eighteen, nineteen and twenty in township ten north of range six east, Willamette meridian bears north seventy-seven degrees and fifty-three minutes east eight hundred and thirty-three and four tenths feet distant.

Thence, first course, magnetic variation twenty-three degrees east, north three degrees and five minutes east three hundred and fifty-seven and seven tenths feet to a point from which discovery post bears south sixty degrees and five minutes west ten feet distant; seven hundred and fifteen and four tenths feet to corner No.2, a larch post six inches square, four feet long, marked 2-779 and I-779, from which U.S. location monument No.4, bears north fifty-seven degrees and fifty-four minutes east three thousand two hundred and eighty-one and forty-two hundredths feet distant.

Thence, second course, magnetic variation twenty-three degrees and thirty minutes east, south sixty degrees and five minutes west one thousand and five hundred feet to corner No.3, a larch post six inches square, four feet long, marked 3-779 and 5-779,

Thence, third course, magnetic variation twenty-three degrees east, South three degrees and five minutes west, seven hundred and fifteen and four tenths feet to corner No.4, and not established.

Thence fourth course, magnetic variation twenty-two degrees and thirty minutes east, north sixty degrees and five minutes east, sixteen feet to witness corner to said corner No.4, a larch post four inches square, four feet long, marked W.C.4-779; one thousand five hundred feet to corner No.1, the place of beginning; the survey of the lode claim as above described extending one thousand five hundred feet in length along said Index No.1 vein or lode.

Beginning for the description of the Index No.2 lode claim at corner No.1, identical with corner No.2 of said Index No.1 lode claim from which said section corner bears south fifty-five degrees and twenty minutes east nine hundred and forty-five and nineteen hundredths feet distant.
