Evans the following described premises, to-wit: Lots numbered twenty-five, twenty-six, twenty-three and twenty-four in Block numbered four (4) of the Town of Stevenson according to the official plat of said town on file and of record in the office of the County Auditor for Skamania County Washington, Together with tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging or in anywise appertaining, to have and to hold the same with the appurtenances unto the said Sophronia C. Evans her heirs and assigns forever. This conveyance is intended as a mortgage to secure the payment of a certain promissory note of which the following is a copy to-wit:

On or before one year after date for value received I promise to pay to the order of Sophronia C. Evans one thousand (\$1000.00) dollars with interest thereon payable quarterly at the rate of six per cent per annum from date; and if not so paid the whole sum of both principal and interest to become immediately due and collectible at the option of the holder of this note. If the interest is not paid when due it shall be compounded with the principal and bear like interest principal and interest payable in U.S. Gold Coin. And in case suit is instituted to collect this note or any part thereof I promise to pay such additional sum as the court may adjudge
