

Thence first course, magnetic variation twenty-three degrees and thirty minutes east, north three degrees and five minutes east, three hundred and fifty-seven and seven tenths feet to corner No.2, a fir post four inches square, four feet long, marked 2-779, from which discovery post bears south sixty degrees and five minutes west two hundred and two feet distant.

Thence, second course, magnetic variation twenty-three degrees east, north three degrees and five minutes east three hundred and fifty-seven and seven tenths feet to corner No.3 a larch post six inches square, four feet long, marked 3-779 and 4-779, from which said U.S. location monument No.4 bears north sixty-nine degrees and twenty-five minutes east, two thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight and twenty-one hundredths feet distant.

Thence, third course, magnetic variation twenty-three degrees east, south sixty degrees and five minutes west one thousand five hundred feet to corner No.4, a larch post four inches square, four feet long, marked 4-779 and 3-779.

Thence, fourth course, magnetic variation twenty-three degrees east, south three degrees and five minutes west seven hundred and fifteen and four tenths feet to corner No.5, identical with corner No.3 of said Index No.1 lode claim.

Thence, fifth course, magnetic variation twenty-three degrees east, north sixty degrees and five minutes east one thousand five hundred feet to corner No.1, the place of beginning; the survey of the lode claim as above described extending one thousand five hundred feet in length along said Index No.2, vein or lode.

Beginning for the description of the Index No.3 lode claim, at corner No.1, a larch post six inches square, four feet long, marked 1-779, from which the quarter section corner between said sections seventeen and eighteen bears north forty-five degrees and fifty minutes east nine hundred and ninety and four hundred feet distant, and said U.S. location monument No.4, bears north eighty-three degrees and twenty-one minutes east two thousand and seven hundred and twenty-one and eleven hundredths feet distant.

Thence, first course, south sixty degrees and five minutes west one thousand five hundred feet to corner No.2, a larch post six inches square, four feet long, marked 2-779.

Thence, second course, south three degrees and five minutes west, seven hundred and fifteen and four tenths feet to corner No.3, identical with corner No.4 of said Index No.2 lode claim.

Thence, third course, north sixty degrees and five minutes east one thousand five hundred feet to corner No.4, identical with corner No.3 of said Index No.2 lode claim.

Thence, fourth course, north three degrees and five minutes east three hundred and fifty-seven and seven tenths feet to a point from which discovery post bears south sixty degrees and five minutes west one hundred and twenty-five feet distant; seven hundred and fifteen and four tenths feet to corner No.1, the place of beginning; the survey of the lode claim as above described extending one thousand five hundred feet in length along said Index No.3 vein or lode.

Beginning for the description of the Index No.4 lode claim at corner No.1, a larch post six inches square, four feet long, marked 1-779, from which the quarter corner between said sections seventeen and eighteen bears north sixty-nine degrees and one minute east seven hundred and thirty-five and one hundredth feet distant.

Thence, first course, south three degrees and five minutes west three hundred feet to a point from which discovery post bears south eighty-six degrees and fifty-five minutes east fifty-one feet distant; six hundred feet to corner No.2, a larch post six inches square four feet long, marked 2-779 and 1-779 situate on line 4-1 of said Index No.3 lode claim.

Thence, second course, south eighty-six degrees and fifty-five minutes east one thousand five hundred feet to corner No.3, a larch post six inches square, four feet long, marked 3-779 and 4-779.

Thence, third course, north three degrees and five minutes east five hundred and seventy-two and three tenths feet to witness corner to corner No.4 a larch post six inches square,
