The west half of the Northwest quarter of Section 25 in Township 3 North of Range 8

East of Willamette Meridian; together with tenements hereditaments and appurtenances
thereunto be, oinging or in a nywsic appertaining. To have and to hold the same together
with the appurtenances unto the said Ellen M. Woodward her heirs and assigns forever.

This coveyance is intended as a mortgage to secure the payment of the sum of one
thousand dollars in accordance with the tenor of a certain instrument of writing
of wich the follwoing is a copy to-wit:

Two years after date without grace we promise to pay to the order of Ellen Woodward at Portland, Oregon one thousand dollars in gold coin of the United states to the present standard value with interest thereon in like gold coin at the rate of 8 per cent per annum from date until paid for value received. Interest to be paid semi-annually and if not so paid the whole sum of both principal and interest to become immediately due and collectible at the option of the holder of said note. And in case, suit or action is instituted to collect this note or any party thereof we premise to pay in addition to the costs and disbursments allowed by slatute such additional sum as the court may adjudge reasonable as attorneys notes in said suit or action.

Now it the sums of money due upon skid instrument shall be paid according to the agreement therein expressed this conveyance shall be void but in case default shall be made in the payment of the principal or interest as above provided then the said Ellem M. Woodward and here legal representatives may sell the premises above described with all and every of the appurtenances or any part thereof in the manner provided by laws and out of the money arising from such sale retain the said principal and interest together with the costs and charges of making such sale and the overplus if any therebe paid over to the said R.L.Edmonston and Myrtle Edmonston theer heirs and assigns; and the part lesof the first part do covenant and agree to pay to the said party of the second part ther heirs and assigns the said sum of money as above mentioned Witnessour hands and seals this 29th day of Sept.1911
