The United States of America, To all to whome these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas William F.Baker, being the owner of a tract of land described as follows: The Northwest quarter of the Northwestbquarter of Section twenty nine in Township thwenty three North of Range seven East of Gila and Salt River Meridian in Aftzona, containing forty acres, situated and included within the limits of a public forest reservation known and designated as the San Francisco Forest Mountain Reserve in Arizona, has under the provisions of the act approved June 4th 1897, entitled "An act making appropriations for sundry covol expenses of the Government for the fiscal year ending June thirtieth 1898 and for other purposes, reconveyed and relinquished the said tract to the United States and has, under the provisions of said act, selected in lieu thereof the following described tract of vacant public land now open for settlement, to wit: The Northeast quarter of the Southeast quarter of Section seventeen in Township three North of Renge seven East of Willame te Meridian, in Washington, containing forty acres.

Now Know Ye, That the United States of America in consideration of the premises and in conformity with the aforesaid act, have given and granted and by these presents do give and grant unto the sad William F.Baker and to his heirs the lands last above described; To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances of whatever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said William F.Baker and unto his heirs and assigns forever. And there is reserved from the lands hereby granted a right of way thereon for ditches and canals constructed by authority of the United States.
