United States to E.B. Perrin

The United States of America, To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting: Whereas Edward B. Perrin being the owner of a tract of land described as follows: The South half of the Southwest quarter of Section twenty one in township twenty one North of Range two East of Gila and Salt River Meridian in Arizona, containing eighty acres, situated and included wathin the limits of a public forest reservation, known and officially designated as the San Francisco Mountains Forrest Reserve in Arizona, has under the provision of the act approved June 4,1897 , entitled " An act making appropriations for sundry civil expenses of the Government for the fiscal year ending June thirtieth, eighteen hundred and ninety eight, and for other purposes", reconveyed and reliquished the said tract to the United States and has, under the provisions of said act selected in lieu thereof the following described tract of vacant public land now open for settlement, to-wit: The lot numbered one and the Southeast quarter of the Northwest quarter of Section eighteen in Township two North of Range seven east of Willamette Meridian in Washington, containing ninety acres and sixty hundredths of an acre. Now Know Ye, that the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the aforesaid act, have given and granted and by these presents do give and grant unto the said Edward B. Perrin, and to his heirs the lands last above described: To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, imminities and appurtenances of Whatever nature thereunto belonging, into the said Edward B.Perrin and to his heirs and assing forever. And there is reserved from the lands granted, a right of way thereon for ditches of canals contructed

In Testimony Whereof, I Theodore Roosevelt, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made patent, and the seal of the General Land office to be hereunto affixed. Given under my hand at the City of Washiggton, the thirtieth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and five and of the Independence of the United States the one hundred and thirtieth.
