The United States of America To all to whomethese Presents shall come, Greeting: Whereas in pursuances of the provisions of the Rivised Statutes of the United States, Chapter Six, Title thirty-two and legislation supplemental thereto, there have been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States the Plat and Field Notes of survey and the Certificate No.7, of the Register of the Land Office at Vancouver, in the State of Washington, accompanied by other evidence whereby it appears that Henry W.Coe did, on the twenty second day of December A.D. 1905 duly enter and pay for that certain mining claim or premises known as the United Mines Group consisting of the Mary No.I/Mary No.2, Mary No.3, Mary No.5 and Mary No.6 Lode mining claims designated by the Surveyor General as Lot No. 780 embracing a portion of Section five in township nine north, and of section thirty one and thirty two in township ten north, of range six east, Willamette Meridian, in the St. Helens Mining District, in the County of Skama ia and State of Washington, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Vancouver and bounded described and platted as follows, with magnetic variation twenty three degrees east: Beginning for the description of Mary No.I lode mining claim at corner No.I.a larch post six inches square, four feet long, marked I-780 on side facing claim, from which the quarter section corner between section five in township nine north of range six east, and section thirty two in township ten north of range six east Willamette Meridian, bears north sixty six degrees and twenty seven minuts east four hundred and twenty and thirty nine hundredths feet distant. Thence first course, north thirty four degrees and thwenty three minuts west one thousand five hundred feet to corner No 2,a larch post six inches square, four feet long marked 2-780 from which U.S.Location monument No.6 bears south twenty five degrees and forty six minuts east one hundred and eleven and five hundredths feet distant. Thence second course, south fifty five degrees and thirty seven minuts west three hundred and eighty five feet to a point from which discovery post bears south thirty four degrees and twenty three minuts east eighteen and five tenths feet distant, six hundred feet to corner No.3, a larch post six inches square, four feet long marked 3-780 and I-780. Thence third course south thirty four degrees and twnety three minuts east one thousand five hundred feet to corner No.4,a larch post six inches square , four feet long, marked 4-780. Thence fourth course, north fifty five degrees and thirty seven minuts east six hundred feet to corner No.I the place of beginning; the survey of the lode claim as above described extending one thousand and five hundred feet in lenght along said Mary No.I vein or lode

Beginning for the description of the Mary No.2 claim at corner No.1identical with corner No.3 of said Mary No.I lode cla im, from which the corner common the sections five and six in twonship nine north and sections thirty one and thirty two in towship ten north of range six east willamette Meridian bears north fifty two degrees and thriteen minuts west one thousand one hundred and sixty eight and fifty two hundredths feet distant. Thence first course north fifty five degrees and thirty seven minuts east two hundred and fifteen feet to a point from which discovery post bears north thirty four degrees and twenty three minuts east seventeen and eight tenths feet distant; six hundred feet to corner No.2, identical with corner No.2 of said Mary No.I lode claim. Thence second course, north thirty four degrees and twenty three minuts west onethousand five hundred feet to corner No. 3 a larch post six inches square, four feet long marked 3-780. Thence thirs course, south fifty five degrees and thirty seven minuts west six hundred feet to corner No. 4, a larch post six inches square, marked 4-780. Thence Fourth course south thirty four degrees and twenty three minuts east one thousand five hundred feet to corner No.I the place of beginning the survey of the lode claim as above described
