a fir post six inches square four feet long marked 3-780 and 2-780 situate on line 4-I of said Mary No.4 lo de claim. Thence third course, south fiftyfive degrees and thirty seven minuts west three hundred and two feet to a point from which discovery post bears south thorty four degrees and twenty three minuts east nineteen feet distant; six hundred feet to corner No. 4 a larch post six inches square four feet long marked 4-78 0 and I-780. Thence fourth course, south thirty four dergrees and twenty three minuts east one thousand five hundred feet to corner No.I the place of beginning; the survey of the lode claim above descrobed extending one thousand five hundred feet in lenght along said Mary No.5 vein or lode.

Beginning for the description of the Mary No.6 lode claim at corner wo.I identical with corner No.4 of said Mary No.5 lode claim, from which said section corner bears south twenty four degrees and twesty six minuts east one thousand two hundred and forty one and twnety two hundredths feet distant. Thence first course, north fifty f ive degrees and thirty seven minuts east three hundred and six feet to a point from which discovery post bears north thirty four degrees and twenty three minuts west sixteen feet; distant; six hundred feet to corner No. 2 a fir post six inches square four feet long marked 2-780 and 3-780. Thence second course, north thirty four degrees and twnety three minuts west six hundred and ten and seventy six hundredths feet to corner No.3 identical with corner No.6 of said Mary No.4 claim lode. Thence third course, south fifty five degrees and thirty seven minuts west one hundred and ninety four and fortynine hundredths feet to corner No.4, a hemlock post five inshes square four feet long marked 4-780. Thence fourth course north thirtyfour degrees and twenty three minuts west eight hundred and eighty nine and twenty four hundredths feet to corner No.5 a fir post five inches square four feet long marked 5-780. Thence fifth course, south fifty five degrees and thirty seven minuts west four hundred and five and fifty one hundredths feet to corner No.6 a hemlock post six inches square four feet long marked 6-780. Thence sixth course, south thirty four degrees and ##m twenty three minuts east one thousand five hundred feet to corner No.I the place of beginning The survey of the lode claim as above described extending one thousand five hundred feet in lenght along said Mary No.6 vein or lode. Said lot No.780 containing ninety nine acres and two hundred and seventy four thousandths of an acre of land, more or less.

Now Know Ye that there is therefore hereby granted by the United States unto the said Henry W.Coe and to his heirs and assigns, the said mining premises, hereinbefore described, and not expressly exvepted from these presents and all that portion of the said Mary No.I, Mary No.2, Mary No.3, Mary No.4, Mary No.5 Mary No.6 veins, lodes or ledges and all of other veins, lodes or ledges throughout their entire depth, the top or apexes of which lie inside of the surface boundary line of said granted premises in said Lot No.780, extending downward vertically, although such veins, lodes or ledges in their downward course may so far depart from a perpenticular as to extend outside the vertical side lines of said premises: Provided that the right of possession to such outside parts of said veins lodes or ledges shall be confined to such portions thereof as lie between vertical planes drawn downward through the end lines of said Lot No.780, so continued in their own direction that such plans will intersect such exterior parts of said veins, lodesor ledges: And provided further, that nothing herein contained shall authorize the grantee herein to enter upon the surface of a claim owned or possessed by another.

To Have and to Hold said mining premises, together with all the rights privileges and immunities and appurtenances of whatever nature thereunto belonging unto the grantee above named and to his heirs and assigns forever; subject nevertheless to the above mentioned and to the following conditions and stipulations. First that the premises hereby granted with the exception of the surface, may be entered by the proprietor of any other vein, lode, or ledge, the top or apex of which lies outside of the boundar; of said granted premises, should the same in its dip be found to penetrate, intersect, or extend into said prem ises, for the purpose of extracting and removing the ore from such other vein, lode or ledge. Second. That the premises hereby granted shall be
