The United States of America, to all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, In pursuance of the provisions of the Revised Statutes of the United States, Chapter Six, Title Thirty-two, and legislation supplemental thereto, there have been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States the Plat and Field Notes of survey and the Certificate, No 8, of the Register of the Land Office at Vancouver in the State of Washington accompanied by other evidence whereby it appears that Henry W. Coe did, on the twenty-second day of December, A.D.1905, duly enter and pay for that certain mining claim or premises known as the Spirit Lake group consisting of the America No.1, America No.2, America No.3, America No.4, Sweden No.1, Sweden No.2, Viola Second, Viola First, Wilson, Alderman Peak Marchland, Prince, Wayne, George, Baby Barnes, Mamie, Mabel, Ada, Linnie, Inez, Cena, Lakeside, Earl, Hillside, The Falls, and Spirit Lake lode mining claims designated by the Surveyor-General as Lot No 781 A, embracing a portion of sections one and twelve, in township nine north of range five east; of section six, in township nine north of range six east; of section thirty-six, in township ten north of range five east and of section thirty-one in township ten north of range six east, Willamette meridian, in the St. Helens unorganized, Mining District, in the County of Skamania and State of Washington, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Vancouver and bounded, described, and platted as follows, with magnetic variation twenty-three degrees east. Beginning for the description of the America No.1 lode claim at corner No.1 a larch post four inches square, four feet long, marked 1-781 A. 4-781 A. and 2-620, identical with corner No.2 of the Norway lode claim survey No.620 from which U.S. location monument No.1 bears north one degree and eight minutes west seven hundred and fourteen and nine tenths feet distant, and the corner common to townships nine and ten north of ranges five and six east, Willamette Meridian, bears south twenty-four degrees and thirty-three minutes west one thousand seven hundred and eighty-four and ninety-eight hundredths feet distant. Thence, first course, north eighty-eight degrees and twenty-eight minutes east five hundred and five feet to corner No.2, a larch post six inches square, four feet long marked 2-781-A. and 1-781-A. Thence, second course, north seven degrees and twenty-seven minutes west one thousand five hundred feet to corner No.3, a hemlock post six inches square, four feet long, marked 3-781-A and 5-781-A. Thence, third course, south eighty-eight degrees and twenty-eight minutes west two hundred and ninety feet to a point from which discovery post bears south seven degrees and twenty-seven minutes east three hundred and eighteen feet distant; five hundred and five feet to corner No.4, a larch post four inches square, four feet long, marked 4-781 A. Thence, fourth course, south six degrees and twenty-six minutes east nine hundred and thirty-seven and eight tenths feet to corner No.5, a cedar post four inches square, four feet long, marked 5-781 A, 1-620 and 2-620 identical with corner No.1 of said Norway lode claim and corner No.2 of the Norway Northwest Discovery lode claim survey No.620, from which said U.S. Location monument No.1 bears north twenty-five degrees and seventeen minutes east one hundred and seventy-six and three tenths feet distant. Thence, fifth course, south nine degrees and nine minutes east five hundred and sixty-two and five tenths feet to corner No.1, the place of beginning; the survey of the lode claim as above described extending one thousand five hundred feet in length along said America No.1 vein or lode.

Beginning for the description of the America No.2 lode claim at corner No.1, a larch post six inches square, four feet long, marked 1-781 A.; 1-781 A, 4-781 A and 2-620, identical with corner No.2 of the Denmark Discovery lode claim survey No.620, from which said U.S.
