Hewett to Young

This Indenture witnesseth that George Hewett and Hannah Mary Hewett husband and wife parties of the first part for and in consideration of the sum of one thousand dollars to them in hand paid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained and sold and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and convey unto Mrs. Nellie Young, party of the second part the following described real property situated in the County of Skamania State of Washington to-wit:

The Northeast quarter (NE $\frac{1}{4}$) of the Southeast quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section seven (7) Township three (3) North of Range ten (10) East of Willamette meridian containing 40 acres more or less, Together with tenements hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging or in anywise appertaining. To have and to hold the same unto the said Mrs. Nellie Young her heirs and assigns forever. This conveyance is intended as a mortgage to secure the payment of the sum of one thousand dollars in accordance with the tenor of a certain instrument of writing of which the following is a copy:

Two years after date without grace I, we or either of us promise to pay to the order of Mrs. Nellie Young at the office of the Butler Banking Co. Hood River Oregon one thousand dollars in gold coin of the United States of the present standard value with interest thereon in like gold coin at the rate of 8 per cent per annum from date until paid for value received. Interest to be paid semi-annually and if not so paid the whole sum of both principal and interest to become immediately due and collectible at the option of the holder of this note. And in case suit or action is instituted to collect this note or any portion thereof I, we or either of us promise and agree to pay in addition to the costs and disbursements provided by statute such addition sum as the Court may adjudge reasonable as attorneys fees in said suit or action.
