Fisher of the City of Portland State of Oregon, the party of the second part Witnesseth: That the said party of the first part for and in consideration of the sum of four thousand five hundred (4500) dollars gold coin of the United States to it in hand paid by the said party of the second part the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained and sold and by these presents does bargain sell and convey unto the said party of the second part and unto her heirs and assigns all of the following real estate situated lying and being in the County of Skamania State of Washington to-wit: Being all of the Northeast quarter (NE $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section No. twenty-two (22) in Township No. four (4) North of Range No. nine (9) East of the Willamette Meridian, containing 160 acres, according to government survey thereof. Together with all and singular the tenements hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belongin. This conveyance is inteded as a mortgage to secure the payment for the sum of four thousand five hundred dollars in accordance with the tenor of five certain promissory notes of which the following are copies to-wit:
