

shall issue for land so selected as though it had been originally granted; and Whereas the following described lands have been selected by the duly authorized agent of the Northern Pacific Railway Company under the provisions of the Act of July 1, 1898 aforesaid, and the lands given as bases therefore are within the limits of the grant, lie opposite the constructed line of the company's road and have been duly relinquished to the United States in accordance with the requirements of said act, and the relinquishment accepted by the Secretary of the Interior, viz:

✓ North of Base line and East of Willamette Meridian, State of Washington, Township Two, Range Seven, The Southwest quarter of the Northwest quarter of Section seventeen, containing forty acres. The Southeast quarter of the Northeast quarter of section eighteen, containing forty acres.

Township thirty-two, Range Nine. The Lot numbered four and the Southwest quarter of the Southeast quarter of Section eighteen, containing sixty-one acres and seventy eight hundredths of an acre.

Township Twenty-two, Range twenty-one, The Lots numbered one, two, three and four and the South half of the Northwest quarter of Section twenty, containing two hundred and thirty eight acres and twenty hundredths of an acre, The said tracts of land as described in the foregoing make the

aggregate area of three hundred and seventy nine acres and ninety eight hundredths of an acre

Now Knew Ye, that the United States of America, in consideration of the premises and pursuant to the said acts of Congress, Have Given and Granted, and by these present do Give and Grant unto

the said Northern Pacific Railway Company, successors in interest to the Northern Pacific Railroad Company, its successors and assigns the tracts of land selected as aforesaid and embraced in the foregoing. To Have and to hold the said tracts with the appurtenances thereof unto the said Northern Pacific Railway Company, its successors and assigns forever.

In Testimony Whereof I, Theodore Roosevelt, President of the United States of America, have caused these letter to be made patent and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
