The United States of America, To all to whom these presents shall come Greeting:

Whereas the Aztec Land and Cattle Company Limited, being the owner of a tract of land described as follows: The Southwest quarter of the Northwest quarter of Section twenty one in Township eleven North of Range nineteen East of Gile and Salt River Meridian in Arizona, situated: and included within the limits of a public forest reservation known and officially designated as the Black Mesa Forest Reserve in Arizona, has under the provosions of the act approved June 4.1897 entitled "An act making appropriations for sundry civil expenses of the Government for the fiscal year ending June thirtieth, eighteen hundred and ninety eight and for other purposes2, reconveyed and relinquished that add tract to the United States and has under the provisions of said act selected in lieu thereof the following described tract of land now open for settlement, to-wit: The Northeast quarter of the Southwest quarter of section eight in township three north of Range nine east of the Willamette "Meridian in Washington containing forty acres."

Now Know Ye that the United States of America in consideration of the preimises and in conformity withouthe aforesaid act have given and granted and by these presence do give and grant unto the said Aztec Land and Cattle Company Limited and to its successors the lands last above described: To have and yo hold the same unto the said Aztec Land and Cattle Comapny Limited and to its successors and assigns for every. And there is reserved from the lands hereby granted a right of way thereon for ditches and canals constructed by authority of the United States.

In Testimony Whereof I, Theodore Soosevelt, President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made patent and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
