County Cause No. 4790-C, which decree determined the rights of all known claimants to the use
 of the waters of SPRING CREEK DRAINAGE BASIN

DOMESTIC USE

The water right is confirmed in the amount of water that is reasonably and actually necessary
 for the purpose aforesaid and shall not exceed 0.02 cubic foot per second, as needed,
 1 acre foot per year.

That the decree aforesaid establishes said right in Class III, with a priority date of
 19 12

That the approximate point(s) of diversion are as follows:

575 feet north and 900 feet west of the SE cor. of Sec. 27,
 T. 2 N., R. 6 E.W.M.

That said water right was adjudged by said decree to be and is appurtenant to the following
 described real property situated in SKAMANIA County, Washington, to-wit:

E½SW¼SE¼SE¼ of Sec. 27, T. 2 N. R. 6 E.W.M.

This certificate of adjudicated water right is specifically subject to relinquishment for nonuse of
 water as provided in Chapter 90.14 RCW
