

April, 1911 and filed for record in the office of the County Auditor of Skamania County, Washington on April 27, 1911, appropriating thirty (30) cubic feet of water from Buck Creek in said Skamania County, which said water right has been conveyed by the said Mike Thornton to the said A.Y. Marsh by instrument of even date herewith, and conveyed by said Marsh to the grantor herein.

And that portion of said property hereby released is described as follows:

A strip of land of varying width across the northeast quarter of the southeast quarter of Section three, township three north range ten east of the Willamette Meridian, bounded on the northwesterly side by a line one hundred feet from ordinary high water in the White Salmon River, and on the southeasterly side by the center line of the said White Salmon River, Containing four and nine hundredths (4.09) acres, more or less, and also a tract described as follows:

Beginning at the southeast corner of the west half of the southeast quarter of the northeast quarter of section three, township three north of range ten east Willamette Meridian; thence west along the south line of said west half ninety feet more or less to a point one hundred feet from ordinary high water in White Salmon River; thence in a northerly direction one hundred feet from and parallel to the said ordinary high water line seven hundred feet more or less, to a point on the east line of said west one-half of the southeast quarter of the northeast quarter of section three; thence south along said east line of west one-half, to the line between lots 305 $\frac{1}{2}$ and 306, Fruit Home Colony, produced westerly; thence easterly along said dividing line between lots 305 $\frac{1}{2}$ and 306, Fruit Home Colony, to the center of white Salmon River; thence following along the center of the White Salmon River to the south line of the southeast quarter of the northeast quarter of Said section three; thence along the south line of the southeast quarter of the northeast quarter of said section three to the point of beginning, containing one and ninety one-hundredth (1.90) acres, more or less, And also a tract described as follows:

Beginning at the southwest corner of the north half of the northeast quarter of the southeast quarter of section three, township three north, range ten east Willamette Meridian, south sixty-two degrees twenty three minutes west, fourteen hundred fifty-two and seven-tenths feet (1457.7) from the quarter corner between sections two and three, said township and range; thence north sixty-one degrees fifty-five minutes east three hundred eighty-five feet; thence north fifteen degrees no minutes east one hundred and twelve (112) feet; thence north twenty-five degrees fifty-six minutes west four hundred eighty-two and six-tenths feet (482.6); thence north seventeen degrees fifteen minutes west four hundred and sixty feet (460); thence north sixty-six degrees thirty minutes east forty-eight (48) feet across Mill Creek; thence south thirty-one degrees thirty minutes east five hundred and eighty-eight feet; thence north eighty-six degrees forty-five minutes east one hundred and seventy feet more or less to a point one hundred feet from ordinary high water in the White Salmon River; thence in a southwesterly direction eleven hundred and fifty feet (1150.00) more or less, along a line one hundred feet (100) ft. from and parallel to the said ordinary high water line to the west line of said northeast quarter of southeast quarter of ~~XXXXXXXXXXXXXX~~ of section three; thence northerly along subdivision line one hundred and ninety (190.00ft) feet more or less to the point of beginning, containing six and thirty-seven hundredths (6.37) acres, more or less, and also a certain tract described as follows:

A strip of land across the northwest quarter of the northeast quarter of section two township three north of range ten east Willamette Meridian, varying from one hundred and thirty feet (130) ft. to one hundred and fifty feet (150 ft.) in width, bound on the easterly side by the center line of the White Salmon River, and on the westerly side by a line parallel to and one hundred feet (100 ft) from the line of ordinary high water in the said White Salmon River, containing four and sixty-one hundredths (4.61) acres, more or less. And also a tract described as follows:

Beginning at a point on the north and south line through the center of section two, township three, north range ten east Willamette Meridian, south two degrees eight minutes east (S 2 deg. 8 min. E) eleven hundred fifty and seven-tenths (1150.7 ft) from the quarter-corner on the north line of said section two; thence north two degrees eight minutes west (N 2 deg. 8 min. W) along said center section line one hundred thirty-five feet (135.00 ft.); thence north fifty-two degrees thirty
