

Notice of Mining Location

Relocation Notice

STATE OF ~~OREGON~~ Washington

County of Skamania

Copper Creek Mining District

NOTICE HEREBY IS GIVEN that the undersigned locators, each a citizen of the United States or one who has declared his intention to become such, have discovered a vein or lode of mineral bearing rock in place upon the unappropriated public domain of the United States within the State of ~~Oregon~~ and said Mining District; and, in accordance with the laws of the United States, of the State of ~~Oregon~~ and the regulations of said Mining District, have located and do hereby locate a claim upon such vein or lode by posting this notice of such discovery and location on a substantial post at the point of discovery, marked Post No. 1. The name of the claim is Clearwater #1 - Claim, further described as follows:

Commencing at a post marked No. 1 (Discovery Post), from thence

— 450 feet in a northwesterly direction to an end post marked No. 2, thence— 350 feet in a northwesterly direction to a corner post marked No. 3, thence— 1500 feet in a southwesterly direction to a corner post marked No. 4, thence— 350 feet in a southeasterly direction to an end post marked No. 5, thence— 250 feet in a southeasterly direction to a corner post marked No. 6, thence— 1500 feet in a northwesterly direction to a corner post marked No. 7, thence— 250 feet in a northwesterly direction to said end post marked No. 2.

The locators claim

— 450 feet in a northwesterly direction from point of discovery to the #2 post, NE end line and — 1050-feet in the opposite direction from point of discovery to the #5 post, SE end line and350 + 250 feet on each side of the middle of said vein or lode, further claiming all the surface rights,

privileges and minerals, with all dips, spurs, angles and variations, and other rights granted by existing laws

and customs. This claim is further described as being 250 feet from a natural object or permanent monu-

ment in the vicinity, to-wit: T4N, Sec 31, R5E (use township and range, if possible)

The north-east-south-east side line of Clearwater #1 runs 250' northwesterly from the Copper Creek bridge.

The general course or strike of the vein or lode as nearly as may be determined is

with reference to the natural object or permanent monument described above. The adjoining claims are

O'Leary's Copper Creek Claim #1 on the south-east sideof Clearwater Claim #1, and Clearwater Claim #2on the south end of Clearwater #1.

"The whole or any part of location #2, Clearwater Claim #1, is located as abandoned property."

This notice is placed at discovery post No. 1; posts are placed at each corner and both center ends, and the name of this vein or lode and date of location are placed on all posts so that the boundaries of the claim may be readily traced. In construing this location notice, the singular includes the plural and vice versa, where the context so requires.


