NOTICE HEREBY IS GIVEN that the undersigned locators, each a citizen of the United States or one who has declared his intention to become such, have discovered a vein or lode of mineral bearing rock in place upon the unappropriated public domain of the United States within the State of Wash. and said Mining District; and, in accordance with the laws of the United States, of the State of Wash. and the regulations of said Mining District, have located and do hereby locate a claim upon such vein or lode by posting this notice of such discovery and location on a substantial post at the point of discovery, marked Post No. 1. The name of the claim is Copper Creek #2 Claim, further described as follows:

Commencing at a post marked No. 1 (Discovery Post), from thence, more or less,

— 350 feet in a north easterly direction to an end post marked No. 2, thence

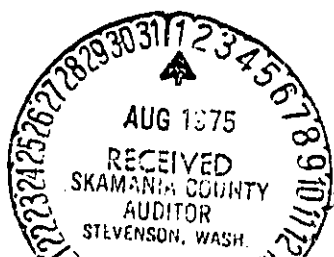
