The United States of America, to all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas in pursuance of the provisions of the Revised Statutes of the United States, Chapter six, Title Thirty-two and legislation supplemental thereto, there have been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States the plat and field notes of survey and the Certificate No. 14 of the Register of the Land Office at Vancouver in the State of Washington, accompanied by other evidence whereby it appears that the Mt. Fairy Mining Co., did on the ninth day of December A.D. 1907 duly enter and pay for that certain mining claim or premises known as the Mountain Fairy No. 1 and Mountain Fairy No. 2, designated by the Surveyor General as Survey No. 762, embracing a portion of Section five in Township nine North and of section thirty-two in Township ten north all in Range six East of the Willamette Meridian in the St. Helens Mining District in the County of Skamania State of Washington, in the district of lands subject to sale at Vancouver, and bounded, described and platted as follows, with magnetic variation twenty-three degrees east:

Beginning, for the description of the Mountain Fairy No. 1 lode claim at corner No. 1 a fir post four feet long, six inches square marked No. 1-762 and 2-762, from which the quarter corner between section five in Township nine north and section thirty-two in Township ten north all in range six East of the Willamette Meridian, bears south twenty seven degrees, six minutes east one thousand four hundred seventy six and three tenths feet distant; Thence first course, north thirty four degrees twenty three minutes west one thousand five hundred feet to corner No. 2, a larch post four feet long, six inches square, marked 2-762; thence second course, south fifty five degrees thirty seven minutes west six hundred feet to corner No. 3, a larch post four feet long, six inches square, marked 3-762; thence third course, south thirty four degrees twenty three minutes east one thousand five hundred feet to corner No. 4 a fir post four feet long four inches square marked 4-780 and 3-780, from which U.S. Location Monument No. 6 bears south seventy one degrees twenty-three minutes west seventeen and three tenths feet distant.; thence fourth course, north fifty five degrees thirty seven minutes east two hundred two feet to a point from which discovery bears north thirty four degrees twenty three minutes west six feet distant; six hundred feet to corner No. 1, the place of beginning; the survey of the lode claim, as above described, extending one thousand five hundred feet in length along said Mountain Fairy No. 1 vein or lode.
