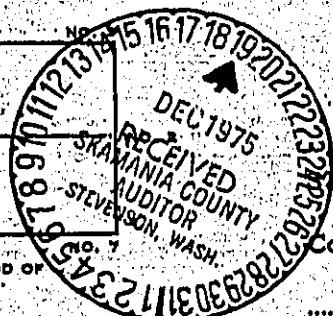

Amendment Notice of Mining Location Relocation Notice

STATE OF ~~Oregon~~ WashingtonCounty of SkamaniaCopper Creek Mining District

NOTICE HEREBY IS GIVEN that the undersigned locators, each a citizen of the United States or one who has declared his intention to become such, have discovered a vein or lode of mineral bearing rock in place upon the unappropriated public domain of the United States within the State of ~~Oregon~~ and said Mining District; and, in accordance with the laws of the United States, of the State of ~~Oregon~~ and the regulations of said Mining District, have located and do hereby locate a claim upon such vein or lode by posting this notice of such discovery and location on a substantial post at the point of discovery, marked Post No. 1. The

name of the claim is Star Creek #39 Claim, further described as follows: 600 feet wide by 1500 feet deep.

Commencing at a post marked No. 1 (Discovery Post), from thence

15 feet in a east direction to an end post marked No. 2, thence
300 feet in a north direction to a corner post marked No. 3, thence
1500 feet in a west direction to a corner post marked No. 4, thence
300 feet in a south direction to an end post marked No. 5, thence
300 feet in a south direction to a corner post marked No. 6, thence
1500 feet in a east direction to a corner post marked No. 7, thence
300 feet in a north direction to said end post marked No. 2.

The locators claim 15 feet in a east direction from point of discovery to the (#1 post) east end line and 1485 feet in the opposite direction from point of discovery to the (#5 post) west end line and

300 feet on each side of the middle of said vein or lode, further claiming all the surface rights, privileges and minerals, with all dips, spurs, angles and variations, and other rights granted by existing laws and customs. This claim is further described as being 6,600 feet from a natural object or permanent monument in the vicinity, to wit: T3N, R5E (use township and range, if possible)

North border line of #39 is approx 600 ft south of the confluence of Copper Creek & Star Creek, with its west end line more or less bordering Star Creek.

The general course or strike of the vein or lode, as nearly as may be determined is east-west, with reference to the natural object or permanent monument described above. The adjoining claims are

Star Creek Claims #35 on north side, #37 on west end, #43 on south side, & #40 on east end.

The whole or any part of Star Creek Claims #39 is located as abandoned property.

This notice is placed at discovery post No. 1; posts are placed at each corner and both center ends, and the name of this vein or lode and date of location are placed on all posts so that the boundaries of the claim may be readily traced. In construing this location notice, the singular includes the plural and vice versa, where the context so requires.
