Notice of Location of Placer Claim

NOTICE HEREBY IS GIVEN That the undersigned locators, each a citizen of the United States or one who has declared his intention to become such, have discovered a placer deposit of minerals upon the unappropriated public domain of the United States within the above state, county and mining district, which minerals are subject to location under the mineral and mining laws of the United States, and have located and hereby do locate a placer claim thereon, named the *LITTLE MERILEE* Claim, which is described as follows:

thence *300* feet in a *South Westerly* direction to a post marked No. 5;

thence *300* feet in a *South Westerly* direction to a post marked No. 6;

thence *1500* feet in a *South Easterly* direction to a post marked No. 7;

thence *300* feet in a *North Easterly* direction to the place of beginning.

Beginning at a point feet and feet from the

corner of the *S.E.* quarter of Section *32*, Township *4*

North and Range *5* *East*, Willamette Meridian; thence from said begin-

ning point
