

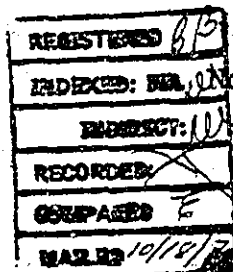

Description of my Claim is as such:

The North Center Post of this Claim is located Three and six-tenths (3.6) miles in a generally Westerly direction from the Trout Creek Bridge, said Bridge being located just Southwest of the Wind River Ranger Station in the Gifford Pinchot National Forest on Forest Service Road Number N411. To reach Claim from aforementioned Bridge, proceed from Bridge in a Southerly direction on Forest Service Road Number N411 to an intersection with Forest Service Road Number N412, thence in a generally Westerly direction on Forest Service Road Number N412 to a point Three and six-tenths (3.6) miles from the aforementioned Trout Creek Bridge.

Northwest Line of said Claim generally lies along Forest Service Road Number N412, and Claim extends in a South-southeasterly direction from the North Line of said Claim. Said Claim is located in Sections Twenty-eight (28) and Thirty-three (33) in Township 4N, Range 7E, and is situated East of the Willamette Meridian. A small portion of the Claim may lie in Sections Twenty-nine (29) and/or Thirty-two (32) of the same aforementioned Township and Range. Said Claim is in Skamania County, Washington, and lies wholly upon publicly owned lands managed by the National Forest Service.

Specifically, the Northwest Line of said Claim is approximately Forty (40) Degrees Magnetic, the Northeast Line is approximately One Hundred Thirty (130) Degrees Magnetic, the Southeast Line is approximately Two Hundred Twenty (220) Degrees Magnetic, and the Southwest Line of the Claim is approximately Three Hundred Ten (310) Degrees Magnetic.
