Notice is hereby given that the undersigned locator/s have discovered a vein or lode of mineral bearing rock in place upon the unappropriated public domain of the United States, within the State of Washington, and said Mining District; and in accordance with the laws of the United States and of the State of Washington, have located a claim upon such vein or lode by posting this notice of such discovery and location on a substantial post at the point of discovery.

The name of the claim is Black Bear #2. This claim is 1500 feet long and 600 feet wide, with the discovery being in the center of the claim the feet continuation of the Black Bear #1 End-Center, further claiming all the surface rights, privileges and minerals, with all dips, spurs, angles and variations, and other rights granted by existing laws and customs.
