

## Notice of Location of Placer Claim

Notice is hereby given that the undersigned, who is a(n) male (or her) declared Natural Born intention, became citizen of the United States, have on this 26th day of February 1900 discovered at the place where this notice is posted a valuable placer deposit bearing Gold and other valuable minerals, and I do hereby locate and claim same as the Go For Broke Placer Placer Mining Claim.

This claim is situated in the Hillard Pinchet National Forest, Mining District in Washington State, Skamania County, local described as: Twp. 36 N. Sect. 20 E. 1/4 N 1/4 E.

The point of discovery whereon this notice is posted is situated Post #1 Claim Post #1.

and from thence the boundaries of said claim are marked and described as follows: Post #1 Post #2 Post #3 Post #4  
To Post #1 South Thence 300 Feet and to Post #2  
Thence 1452 Feet North To Post #3 Thence 300 Feet West To Post  
Marked North Center Thence 300 Feet To Post #4 Thence 1452 Feet  
South To Post #1 The Point of Discovery.

Notice of location must be filed within thirty days from the date of discovery at the office of the auditor of the county in which such discovery was made. Twenty acres may be included in one placer claim and if located on surveyed land it must be according to legal subdivision.

Care must be taken to fully describe the claim with reference to natural objects and permanent monuments, so that the boundaries can be readily traced. *The blank spaces in this form must be carefully and properly filled out.*

The discoverer must perform labor upon such location in developing the same to an amount which shall be equivalent in the aggregate to at least \$10.00 worth of such labor for each twenty acres, or fractional part thereof, contained in such location or claim, within sixty days from the date of discovery, and upon performance of such labor, file with the auditor of the county an affidavit showing such performance and generally the nature and kind of work so done.
