

NOTICE HEREBY IS GIVEN that the undersigned locators, each a citizen of the United States or one who has declared his intention to become such, have discovered a vein or lode of mineral bearing rock in place upon the unappropriated public domain of the United States within the State of Oregon and said Mining District; and, in accordance with the laws of the United States, of the State of Oregon and the regulations of said Mining District, have located and do hereby locate a claim upon such vein or lode by posting this notice of such discovery and location on a substantial post at the point of discovery, marked Post No. 1. The name of the claim is Green Lode No. 2 Claim, further described as follows:

Commencing at a post marked No. 1 (Discovery Post), from the

feet in a northerly direction to a post marked No. 2, thence feet in a northerly direction to a corner post marked No. 3, thence feet in a Southwesterly direction to a corner post marked No. 4, thence feet in a Southwesterly direction to a corner post marked No. 5, thence feet in a Southwesterly direction to a corner post marked No. 6, thence feet in a Northerly direction to a corner post marked No. 7, thence feet in a Southwesterly direction to said end post marked No. 2.

The locators claim feet in a northerly direction from point of discovery to the Northwesterly end line and feet in the opposite direction from point of discovery to the Southwesterly end line and feet on each side of the middle of said vein or lode, further claiming all the surface rights, privileges and minerals, with all dips, spurs, angles and variations, and other rights granted by existing laws and customs. This claim is further described as being feet from a natural object or permanent monument in the vicinity, to-wit: (use township and range, if possible)

Starting at the point where the 1st post is located, to go 100 ft. to the south to bridge the creek, Green Fork of C. G. Creek, to cross it westward up said bearing. Then turn toward Northwest and continue about 200 ft. to another creek, which appears to be a tributary, then go up Creek 100 ft. The general course or strike of the vein or lode as nearly as may be determined is with reference to the natural object or permanent monument described above. The adjoining claims are Green Lode No. 2 and 1/2 located on its borders on its south westerly line. Its discovery point is 200 ft. to the creek in a southerly direction, then going up the creek 100 ft. in a Southwesterly direction to the discovery post of said claim.

This notice is placed at discovery post No. 1; posts are placed at each corner and both center ends, and the name of this vein or lode and date of location are placed on all posts so that the boundaries of the claim may be readily traced. In construing this location notice, the singular includes the plural and vice versa, where the context so requires.



The name of the claim is Green Bear No. 3 Claim, further described as follows:

Commencing at a post marked No. 1 (Discovery Post), from thence
 1400 feet in a north easterly direction to an end post marked No. 2, thence
 100 feet in a north westerly direction to a corner post marked No. 3, thence
 1500 feet in a south westerly direction to a corner post marked No. 4, thence
 100 feet in a south easterly direction to an end post marked No. 5, thence
 500 feet in a south easterly direction to a corner post marked No. 6, thence
 1500 feet in a north easterly direction to a corner post marked No. 7, thence
 500 feet in a north westerly direction to said end post marked No. 2.
 The locators claim 1400 feet in a north easterly direction from point of discovery to the north easterly end line and 100 feet in the opposite direction from point of discovery to the south easterly end line and 100 and 500 feet on each side of the middle of said vein or lode, further claiming all the surface rights, privileges and minerals, with all dips, spurs, angles and variations, and other rights granted by existing laws and customs. This claim is further described as being feet from a natural object or permanent monument in the vicinity, to-wit: Section 13T 4N 5E (use township and range, if possible). Starting at junction of R.R. N. 43 on N. 42, go up N. 43 approx 1.7 mi. To old logging bridge that crosses Green Forks Cr. Go 160 yds. in S. westerly direction up old logging rd. Then turn with rd. N. westerly and continue about 60 yd. To deer trail. Proceed approx 300 yd. northerly and go up creek 100 ft. The general course or strike of the vein or lode as nearly as may be determined is with reference to the natural object or permanent monument described above. The adjoining claims are Green Bear No. 2 and it touches on its south westerly line. The discovery point is 200 ft. to the creek in a south easterly direction then going up the creek 100 ft. in a north westerly direction to the discovery post of this claim.
