Filing deadline nears for miners

Miners with claims on federal land have until Sept. 1 to file an affidavit in the county of their claim that at least \$100 in work has been performed in the last year, the U.S. Bureau of Land Management reports.

If no labor has been performed, miners expecting to retain interest in claims may substitute a notice of intention to hold for the affidavit, according to Shirley Vessella.

"We've had calls from people with claims near Mount St. Helens asking what they need to do," she said. "An application for deferment of assessment work can be in the form of a letter and should state why access was blocked."

A copy of each affidavit filed with a county or the explanation why no work was done must be filed with BLM by Dec. 30. When no documents are received, BLM rules claims on federal land as abandoned.
