

## UNITED STATES OF AMERICA TO WILLIAM DAWSON.

VANCOUVER 02429. MINERAL PATENT LAND DISTRICT: Vancouver, Washington.  
 THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING:

WHEREAS, In pursuance of the Revised Statutes of the United States, Chapter Six, Title Thirty-two, and legislation supplemental thereto, there have been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States; the Plat and Field Notes of Survey and the Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Vancouver, Washington, accompanied by other evidence whereby it appears that William Dawson, did, on August 23, 1911, duly enter and pay for that certain mining claim or premises, known as the Kangaroo No.1, Kangaroo No.2, Kangaroo No.3 and Kangaroo No.5 Lode Mining Claims, designated by the Surveyor-General as Survey No.801, embracing a Portion of Sections Five, Six and Eight in Township Nine north of range six East of the Willamette Meridian, in the St. Helens, Unorganized, Mining District, Skamania County, Washington, and bounded, described, and platted as follows:

Beginning, For the Description of the Kangaroo No.1 Lode Claim, at Corner No.1, a Larch post, Three feet high, four inches square, marked 1 - 801 and 1 - 801, from which the Quarter corner Between Sections Five and Six in Township Nine North of Range Six East of the Willamette Meridian, bears North Fifteen degrees thirty-five minutes west four hundred forty-six feet distant;

Thence, First Course, south Fifteen Degrees thirty-five minutes east one thousand five hundred feet to corner No.2, a Larch post three feet high, four inches square, marked 2 - 801 and 4 - 801, identical with corner No.4 of the Kangaroo No.4 Lode Claim Survey No.801;

Thence, Second course, North Seventy-four Degrees Twenty-five Minutes East Three Hundred Feet to a point from which Discovery bears North Fifteen Degrees Thirty-Five Minutes West one Thousand sixty-two feet Distant; Six Hundred Feet to Corner No.3, a Larch post three feet high, four inches square, marked 3 - 801 and 3 - 801; identical with corner No.3 of said Kangaroo No.4 Lode Claim;

Thence, Third Course, North Fifteen Degrees thirty-five minutes west one thousand five hundred feet to corner No.4, a larch post, three feet high, four inches square, marked 4 - 801 and 2 - 801;

Thence, Fourth Course, South Seventy-Four degrees twenty-five minutes west six hundred feet to corner No.1, the place of beginning; The survey of the lode claim, as above described, extending one thousand five hundred feet in length along said Kangaroo No.1 vein or lode;

Beginning, for the description of the Kangaroo No.2 Lode Claim, at corner No.1, identical with corner No.1 of said Kangaroo No.1 Lode Claim;

Thence, first course, North seventy-four degrees Twenty-five minutes east three hundred feet to a point from which discovery bears north fifteen degrees thirty-five minutes west ten feet distant; six hundred feet to corner No.2, identical with corner No.4 of said Kangaroo No.2 Lode Claim;

Thence, Second course, North Fifteen Degrees Thirty-five minutes west one thousand five hundred feet to corner No.3, a larch post three feet high, four inches square, marked 3 - 801 and 4 - 801;

Thence, Third Course, South Seventy-four Degrees Twenty-five minutes west six hundred feet to corner No.4, a Larch post three feet high, four inches square, marked 4 - 801 and 3 - 801;

Thence, Fourth Course, South Fifteen Degrees Thirty-five minutes east one thousand five hundred feet to corner No.1, the place of beginning; The survey of the Lode claim, as above described, extending one thousand five hundred feet in length along said Kangaroo No.2 vein or lode;

Beginning, for the Description of the Kangaroo No.3 Lode Claim, at corner No.1, a Larch Post, three feet high, four inches square, marked 1 - 801, from which the corner to sections Five and Six in Township Nine North and Sections Thirty-one and Thirty-two in Township ten North all in Range Six East of the Willamette Meridian, bears North eighty-one degrees thirty-five minutes east one hundred three and eight-tenths feet distant;
