

## MANNERS TO NORTHWESTERN ELECTRIC COMPANY.

In consideration of One Dollar, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, William Sutton Manners and Lizzie B. Manners, his wife grant to Northwestern Electric Company a perpetual right of way in and over the following described real property, situated in County of Skamania, State of Washington, to-wit: Lots three and four in Section 29, Township 3 North Range 10 East of the Willamette Meridian. for the purpose of erecting, maintaining and operating thereon, two pole or tower lines for the transmission of electric current; together with the right to cut such trees and brush as may be necessary in constructing, maintaining and operating thereon, two pole or tower lines for the transmission of electric current; together with the right to cut such trees and brush as may be necessary in constructing, maintaining and protecting such lines from damage. The said transmission lines are to be erected between the Spokane, Portland and Seattle Railway right-of-way and the top of the bluff on said lots three and four; one line to be where it is surveyed, staked and located across said lot, the second line to be constructed parallel with and not to exceed fifty feet from the first and in a northerly direction.

Town of Stevenson to Northwestern Electric Co.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That Town of Stevenson, a Municipal corporation of the state of Washington party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of five hundred dollars, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, does by these presents grant, bargain, sell and convey unto Northwestern Electric Company, a corporation of the state of Washington, for the term of fifty years from the date hereof, the right and privilege to construct and maintain a conduit or tunnel or pole line upon, under over and across that strip of land purchased by the town of Stevenson from John F. Sweeney and Mary E. Sweeney, by deed dated August 24th. 1912, being a strip of land 60 feet in width constituting an extension of Second Street to the center of Kanaka Creek Road.

The said conduit tunnel or pole line to be continuation of that conduit, tunnel or pole line
